

Tesla STEM High School Senior Celebration 2026 - Organized by Tesla STEM PTSA

AUTHORIZATION, WAIVER, AND RELEASE FORM

This form is required of the Tesla STEM student (“Student” or “Participant”) who attend the Senior Celebration event (“Event”), on June 12, 2026, at Black Diamond Camp, Auburn, WA, organized by Tesla STEM PTSA.

The waiver and release form (“WAIVER”) must be signed by the student and their parent or legal guardian (“Parent”). The Parent must sign the WAIVER, even if the student is 18 years of age or older. Signature by the Parent reflects consent to the student’s participation in the Event.

This WAIVER must be emailed to waiver@teslastemptsa.org by June 1, 2026. STUDENTS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ON THE BUS OR TO PARTICIPATE IN THE EVENT WITHOUT PTSA RECEIPT OF THIS SIGNED WAIVER.

Authorization

As used below, PTSA shall mean the Tesla STEM Parent Teacher Student Association, and its officers, directors, employees, assignees, and agents (including any third party designated and approved by PTSA) at any time, including, without limitation, individuals or entities involved in print, publication, television, broadcast, or video media. As used below, “Participant” shall mean any individual, student, teacher, or volunteer involved in a PTSA activity. The participant in any PTSA program, meeting, or conference (collectively, the “Event”), agrees to the following:

Assumption of Risk and Waiver

The undersigned being fully cognizant of the risks of participating in the Event, hereby assumes the risks of bodily injury (including, without limitation, death) and property damage, inherent in such participation. Except to the extent due to the willful misconduct of PTSA, to the fullest extent permitted by applicable laws, the undersigned hereby waives any claims or causes of action which they may now or forever have against PTSA arising out of their participation, and they will indemnify and hold harmless PTSA against any and all claims resulting from such participation.

The undersigned also attests and verifies that the Student is in good health and able to participate in this Event. They acknowledge that they are aware of the inherent risks of participating in the various activities available to the Student during the Event.

Release

The undersigned hereby releases PTSA and all officers, directors, employees, agents and volunteers of the organization, and its respective successors, affiliates, licensees and assigns from all claims, demands, liabilities, damages, costs and expenses (including, without limitation, attorney’s and other professional fees and expenses) that they may now or ever have against PTSA arising in connection with the Student’s participation in the Event and PTSA’s exercise of rights hereby granted, including, without limitation, claims for compensation, defamation, or invasion of privacy, or other infringements or violations of personal or property rights of any sort. In the event the Student should sustain injuries or illness while involved in the Event, the undersigned hereby authorizes PTSA to administer, or cause to be administered, such first aid or other treatment and medications as may be necessary under the circumstances, to include treatment by a physician or hospital of the PTSA’s choice. It is further understood that the undersigned will assume full responsibility for any such action, including payment of cost.

This Release shall be binding upon the undersigned’s heirs, personal representatives, and assigns, and shall be governed by and construed under the laws of the Washington State without regard to conflicts of law principles. Venue for any legal action arising out of or in connection with this Release shall be in King County, Washington. This release constitutes the entire agreement among the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter of this Release and supersedes any and all previous agreements among the parties, whether written or oral, with respect to such subject

matter. The undersigned understand that this form involves a release of legal rights. The Student and Parent signing below agrees to all of the foregoing terms on behalf of the minor signing below.

Code of Conduct

This Code of Conduct applies to all persons attending the Senior Celebration PTSA event including, but not limited to, all students, parents, volunteers, and guests. All attendees are expected to conduct themselves in a polite, civil, and respectful manner towards others, and must comply with all applicable laws.

Unacceptable behavior will not be tolerated, such as the following:

- NO abusive language, bullying, discrimination, threatening behavior, sexual harassment, causing physical harm.
- NO alcoholic beverages, cigarettes, vaping paraphernalia, narcotics, firearms, or weapons, in any form, shall be possessed by attendees at any time, under any circumstances.
- All Student attendees must keep their chaperones informed of their activities and/or whereabouts at all times.
- No Student attendee shall leave the event area unless permission has been received from his or her chaperone.
- Identification (event band) must be worn by all attendees at the event and be visible by all chaperones or venue staff.
- School Dress Code must be followed by all attendees. For this event we recommend comfortable clothes, comfortable shoes and since we will be indoors and outdoors, be prepared for Pacific Northwest unpredictable weather.
- All event attendees must follow facility guidelines for adhering signs, notices, posters, etc. to walls, doors, or any facility surface. There shall be no defacing of public property. Any damages to the property or furnishings in the buildings must be paid for by the individual(s) responsible.
- Attendees violating or ignoring any of the conduct rules will be sent home immediately at their own expense.

Safety and Security

The safety and security of all persons who attend the event is of the utmost concern to the PTSA. There are chaperones and staff, provided by PTSA and the event venue. Please report any issue related to safety or security to one of your chaperones immediately. As a necessary precaution, PTSA enforces the following procedures:

- . All participants must register for the event.
- . Event band must be worn by all attendees and be visible to any chaperone or venue staff.
- . The event is not "open to the public."
- . The PTSA Code of Conduct must be followed by all attendees.

Please bring minimum personal items. A list of allowed items will be provided prior to the event. These personal items are the sole responsibility of the attendee who chooses to bring these items. If a participant chooses to bring items of value, s/he is responsible for their safekeeping at all times, including any item of monetary or personal value. PTSA accepts no responsibility for replacement of lost, misplaced, or stolen items and will not replace such items. This policy applies to all attendees.
